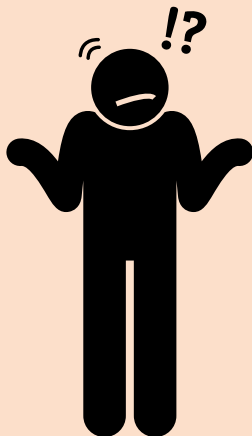
THE GLOBAL GOALS

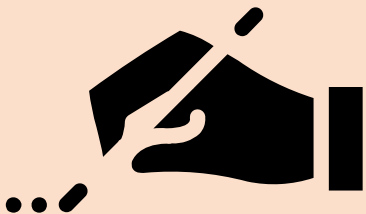
So how can you help?
